I. Intro

- A. Last week, we talked about the unexpected nature of advent
 - 1. 1st advent unbelieving priest and faith-filled little girl
 - 2. 2nd advent a great falling away and a faithful remnant with full lamps
- B. This week, we continue our look at advent in Luke 1:39-80
 - 1. The story keeps a focus on Mary and Zechariah
 - 2. However, this time Zechariah is different
- II. Text

A. Luke 1:39-45

- 1. After hearing the news from Gabriel, Mary visited Elizabeth [MAP]
 - a) Women greet each other Elizabeth is filled with the Holy Spirit
 - b) Elizabeth makes a proclamation
 - (1) Mary is blessed for believing
 - (2) Elizabeth also believes (vs 43)
 - (3) Unborn John believes and rejoices
- 2. This moment speaks volumes about advent
 - a) At the 1st advent the people are marked with belief, confession, and joy
 - b) As we prepare for the second advent we should mirror this atmosphere
 - (1) Make a habit of running to God's people, not the world
 - (2) Join the atmosphere of proclaiming goodness and truth, not spreading lies
 - (3) Let your life be marked by gratitude and joy, not complaints and sarcasm
 - c) This living room scene is a foreshadow of the advent church
 - (1) Is it an accurate picture? If not, what can you do about it?
- 3. One final note that I must make before we continue
 - a) Behold John he is an unborn child and found leaping for joy
 - b) Before birth, John discerns his purpose and position in relation to God
 - c) Don't think for a moment that an unborn child is not a human
 - (1) Babylon has robbed babies in the womb of their humanity
 - (2) But, scripture teaches a different message what will you believe?

B. Luke 1:46-56

- 1. Mary responds to Elizabeth with a song of praise The Magnificat
 - a) The song has specific declarations:
 - (1) God looks on the humble and resists the proud
 - (2) God elevates the humble and humiliates the proud
 - (3) God satisfied the hungry with good things and dismisses the greedy
 - (4) God remembers His covenants and fulfills them in His time
 - b) Song is very familiar if you remember our study in 1 Samuel 2:1-10
 - (1) Hannah prayed for a child, God answered (Samuel), and she sang a song
 - (2) Both songs exalt God, rejoice in salvation, declare the holiness of God, speak of humility/pride, poor/rich, hungry/full, and God's faithfulness
- 2. Why is this connection important?
 - a) At the 1st advent, people knew their Bible!
 - b) During the 2nd advent, people need to know their Bible!
 - c) When God moves or you get squeezed in trials Bible needs to come out!

C. Luke 1:57-66

- 1. This section is so good because it reveals an important aspect of advent
 - a) Advent is marked by transformation!
 - (1) When we first met Zechariah, he was filled with unbelief
 - (2) 9 months later he is changed man
 - b) Conversation about naming the child reveals Zechariah's heart
 - (1) Culture said "You always name the child after dad or grandpa"
 - (2) Zechariah is choosing to follow God's word rather than cultural norms
 - (3) "His name is John" is Zechariah saying "I stand with God, not culture"
- 2. What brought about this change? I suspect it was connected to not speaking
 - a) You can learn a lot if you stop talking so much
 - b) You can learn a lot when walking through trials
 - c) Sometimes you don't know how much you'll learn until the trial is over
- 3. Let's see what Zechariah learned now that his trial is over

D. Luke 1:67-80

- 1. What did Zechariah learn?
 - a) He learned about the unexpected AND transformative ways God works
 - b) God took a religious, ritualistic, unbelieving man and changed his life
 - c) God took Zechariah's voice and replaced it with God's voice
 - d) Unbelief was replaced with bold declarations of God's faithfulness
 - e) Zechariah went from "how can this be" to "this child will be God's holy prophet"
- 2. This moment also speaks volumes about advent
 - a) In this first advent you have a changed man
 - b) During this second advent, God is looking to change men
 - c) He is looking at priests of the home and asking:
 - (1) Do you believe?
 - (2) Will you surrender your voice for my voice?
 - (3) Will you trade your ways for my ways?
- III. Conclusion
 - A. This is why I love advent so much!
 - 1. Our story began in a dark time for Israel unbelief and religion everywhere
 - 2. One man prays and God answers the result is total transformation everywhere
 - 3. If this is the first advent, wrap your arms around the second!
 - a) Are you tired of the way things are?
 - b) Are you tired of the religion and darkness and sorrow?
 - c) Are you tired of the stale Bible reading and shallow expressions of faith?
 - B. Here is what you do PRAY!
 - 1. Pray God will invade your life and change things
 - 2. Pray God will bring joy to your work and ignite your faith
 - 3. Pray God will bless His church and their gathering together
 - 4. Pray God will end sorrow and unbelief in your life
